GOVERNOR RICK SNYDER REAPPOINTS DONNA MURRAY-BROWN TO COMMISSION ON SERVICES TO THE AGING

Commission Oversees Programs Affecting Aging Citizens

LANSING, Michigan – Michigan Nonprofit Association (MNA), a state-wide association serving the nonprofit sector, today announced that Gov. Rick Snyder has reappointed Donna Murray-Brown of Detroit to the Commission on Services to the Aging.



Ms. Murray Brown serves on the 15-member commission appointed by the governor to offer oversight on the administration of state programs and priorities affecting aging Michiganders. A majority of the members must be at least 60 years of age and no more than eight may be from the same political party.

“This is a talented group of appointees and I am confident they will continue to ensure that aging adults have the opportunity to live healthy and independent lives,” Snyder said.

“I am grateful to have been welcomed back to serve on the Commission on Services to the Aging,” said Donna Murray-Brown, MNA President & CEO. “Older citizens have so much to give to our communities and it is important that we support them as much as we can.”
